His other plans include around 1,000 housing units to eventually be built. Not only is this near our home, it's only a few blocks away from our church building.



Perhaps God granted our request for a permanent space for such a time like this—when many would be moving into our area, whether they be those in need of an introduction to Jesus or those Christians who have relocated and are looking for a church in their community.
